Intentions du pape François pour septembre - Prions que les ressources de la planète ne soient pas pillées, mais soient partagées de manière équitable et respectueuse.

Réflexion - Des déséquilibres qui mettent l'humanité en danger - (Réseau mondial de prière du Pape)

Pour donner un exemple de l'utilisation disproportionnée des ressources, selon des rapports internationaux, près d'un milliard d'êtres humains se couchent le ventre vide chaque soir. Non parce qu'il n'y a pas assez de nourriture pour tout le monde, mais à cause de l'injustice profonde qui entoure la production des aliments et leur disponibilité. Parmi les causes, citons la mainmise des entreprises sur la production alimentaire, la crise climatique et l'accès injuste aux ressources naturelles, qui ont toutes un impact sur la capacité des populations à cultiver et à acheter de la nourriture.

Les conséquences sont particulièrement pénibles pour les femmes, qui travaillent dans l'agriculture plus que dans tout autre secteur et produisent une grande partie des aliments consommés dans le monde. D'autre part, dans un rapport sur les industries minières, l'ONU a indiqué que ces dernières posent des défis particuliers pour les États fragiles et les pays en développement. L'exploitation des ressources naturelles non renouvelables, notamment le pétrole, le gaz, les minéraux et le bois, a souvent été identifiée comme l'un des facteurs alimentant ou entretenant des conflits violents dans différentes parties du monde.

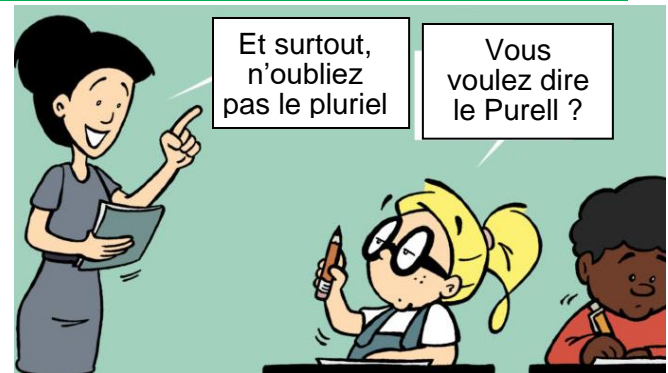

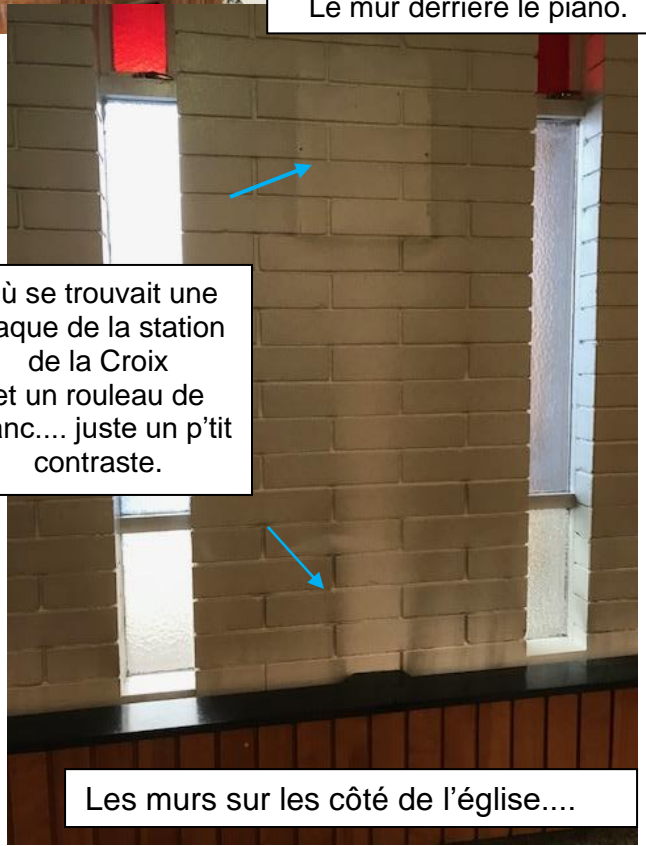

PASS IT ON event is cancelled this year - A message from Pass It On (Clothing Collection) Committee: Dear friends, we are so very grateful for all the support you have given to PASS IT ON – the tremendous success of this program is due entirely to faithful volunteers and partners like you. Unfortunately, we are writing to formally advise that PASS IT ON has been cancelled for 2020. We recently Zoom-met with John Wasch from the Calgary Catholic School District, and due to the COVID situation and the continued restrictions on gatherings, we regretfully finalized this decision. As far as 2021 goes, be confident that we continue to be flexible and will wait for direction, all according to God's Holy Will.

In the meantime, we have been in discussions with Jacket Racket, a program that accepts donations of children's and teen's winter coats and accessories (not boots) for distribution to both CCSD and CBE schools. Jacket Racket is looking for a new home

for their storage/distribution centre so that they may continue to operate (they were previously housed for 10 years at CBE's Kingsland Centre, which has been sold). If they are able to find suitable new accommodation for this fall, we will let you know about how to donate winter coats for students and about volunteer opportunities.
